This unique exhibition is part of *Ink, Image, Impression: A Waunakee Summer of Print Arts.* The exhibition unveils the creative processes of Barry Ebner (monoprints, CA), Misha Goro (copperplate etching & engraving, Chicago), Deborah Maris Lader (tetrapack & lithography, Chicago), and Sirima Sataman (wood block prints, CA). Experience the interplay of concept and execution as finished prints and their originating surfaces are displayed, highlighting each artist's distinct skill and process.

Barry Ebner is a Bay Area based internationally recognized artist who primarily works with techniques of intaglio and monotype. Over the last 25 years he has had over 20 solo exhibitions, throughout

California and the western part of the United States. He received his Bachelor of Arts from the University of Texas and his Master of Fine Arts with an emphasis in Printmaking from the California College of the Arts. Along with pursuing his studio work he is also an Instructor at the Academy of Arts University in San Francisco. He most recently led a printmaking collaboration in Santiago, Chile working with 11 other artists to create an exhibition of collaborative monoprints that were exhibited in Valparaiso, Chile His work can be seen at www.barryebner.com and IG:ebnersart

Deborah Maris Lader is the Founder/Director of the Chicago Printmakers Collaborative since 1989 and a member of the band Sons of the Never Wrong. Exhibiting her prints, drawings, photography, and mixed media internationally, her work is part of numerous permanent collections, including the Chicago History Museum and the New York Public Library. Recognized as the Outstanding Printmaker 2016 by the Mid America Print Council, Lader has also received awards for her contributions to the artistic community, and she was just a finalist in the International On Paper Competition, based in Barcelona. Misha Goro is a Chicago-based artist who was Chair of the the Graphic Art Department at the American Academy. He studied the techniques of Dürer in Galilee, and his works are held in prestigious institutions worldwide, including LUMA (Loyola University Museum of Art, Chicago), the Achille Bertarelli Civic Print Collection (Milan), and the Fondazione II Bisonte (Florence). His copperplate etchings and engravings demonstrate a mastery of traditional printmaking techniques, placing him among distinguished contemporary printmakers.
